### **ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI Camp - Artificial Intelligence Club)**

AI Camp is a fun, hands-on program offered in two groups: Years 1 to 4 and Years 5 to 6. Each session inspires curiosity and creativity, helping children grow as confident, imaginative thinkers in a world shaped by technology.

In Term 1, students will explore “Seeing Like a Machine: An Introduction to Artificial Intelligence.” Through games, stories, and real-life examples, they’ll discover how computers recognise faces, how self-driving cars know when to stop, and how technology learns from data. They’ll also explore areas like Computer Vision and Natural Language Processing, learning to use technology with creativity and care.

Step by step, students will learn to observe, imagine, and create, finishing the term with projects that express how they think technology might see and shape our world.
