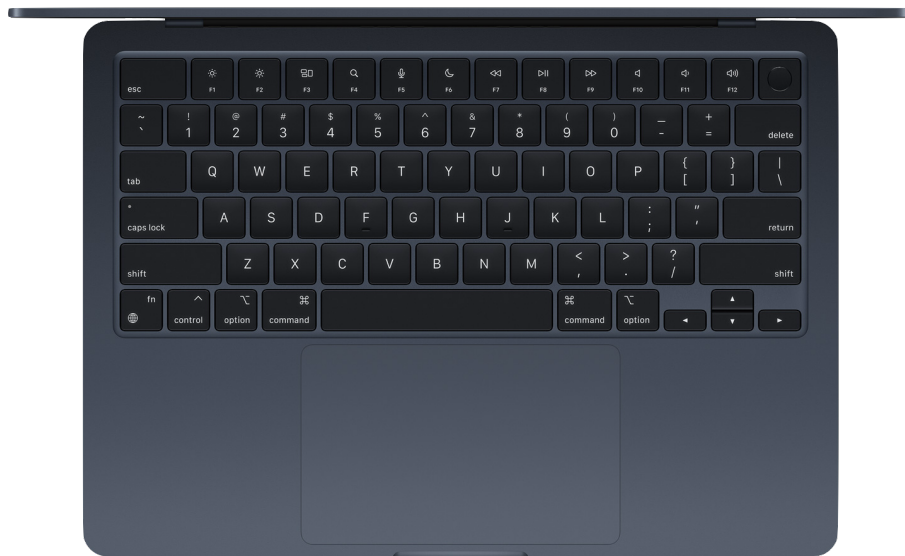




Onboarding your Mac

This guide will help you set up your MacBook running macOS Sonoma.

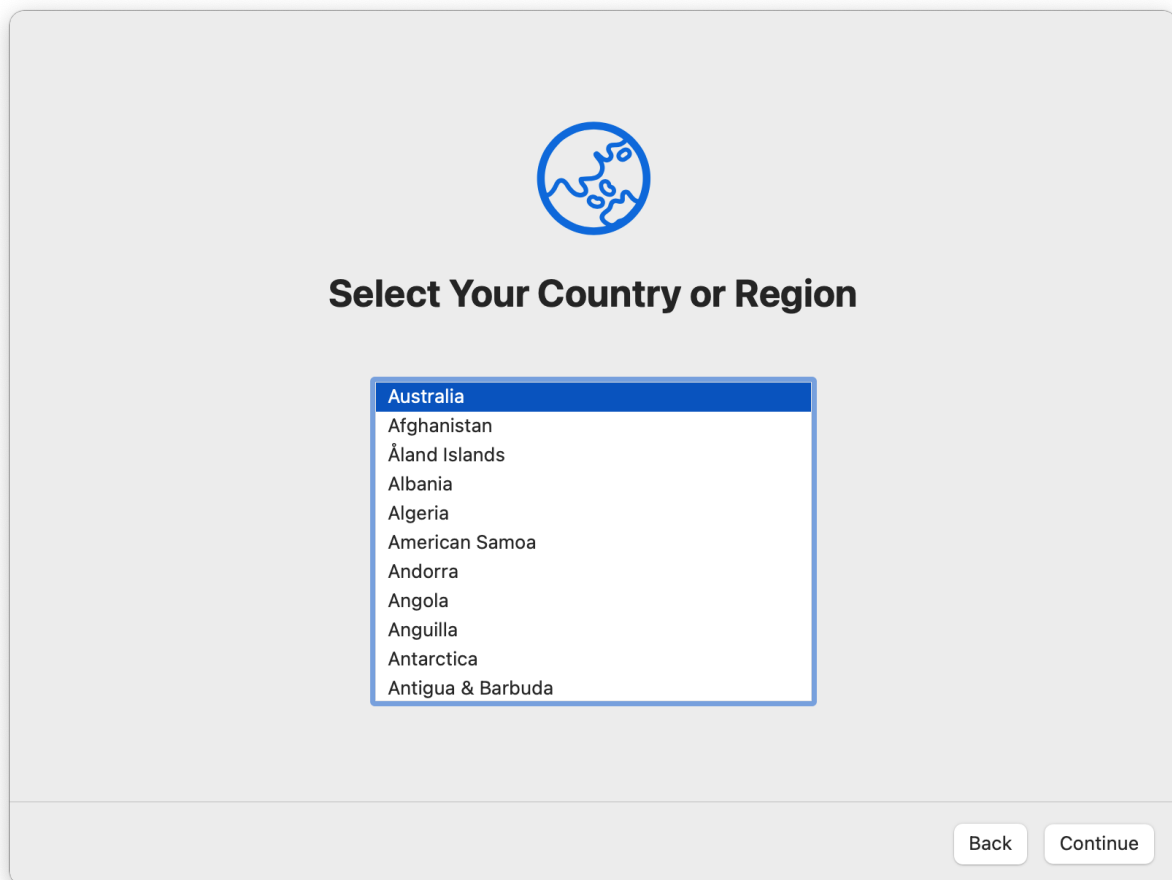

Section 1: Set Up Your MacBook

When you first turn on your MacBook, you'll need to complete Setup Assistant to get your device ready.

Note: If you've already completed Setup Assistant and are on the Desktop, you can skip to the next section.

Follow these steps to complete Setup Assistant:



Select Your Country or Region

1. Choose Australia from the list.
2. Click Continue.

Accessibility

You can set up accessibility features in Setup Assistant. If you don't need these settings, click Not Now.

Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

To finish Setup Assistant, connect to your home Wi-Fi network:

1. Select your home Wi-Fi network name (SSID).
2. Enter your home Wi-Fi password.
3. Click Continue.

Data & Privacy

Click Continue to proceed.

Data & Privacy

Click Continue to proceed.

Migration Assistant

Click Not Now.

Sign In with Your Apple ID

An Apple ID is used for services such as iCloud. You don't need an Apple ID to complete this setup.

Note: You can sign in with your Apple ID later via System Settings after Setup Assistant is complete.

1. Click Set Up Later.
2. Click Skip.

Terms and Conditions

To continue, you must accept the Terms and Conditions.

1. Click Agree.
2. Click Agree again to confirm.

Create a Computer Account

You need to create a Computer Account, which will be the Administrator for your MacBook.

1. Enter your full name (e.g., John Appleseed).

Note: The account name will automatically populate once you enter a password.

2. Enter a password (this will be used to log in to your MacBook).
3. Optionally, enter a hint to help remember your password.
4. Click Continue.

Enable Location Services

Location Services allows apps like Maps and services like Spotlight Suggestions to access data, including your approximate location.

1. Select the box next to Enable Location Services on this Mac.
2. Click Continue.

Analytics

Click Continue to proceed.

Screen Time

Screen Time provides insights into how you spend time in apps and on websites.

Note: You can enable Screen Time later via System Settings after Setup Assistant is complete.

Click Set Up Later.

Siri

Note: You can enable Siri later via System Settings after Setup Assistant is complete.

1. Deselect the checkbox labeled Enable Ask Siri.
2. Click Continue.

Touch ID

1. Click Set Up Touch ID Later.
2. Click Continue.

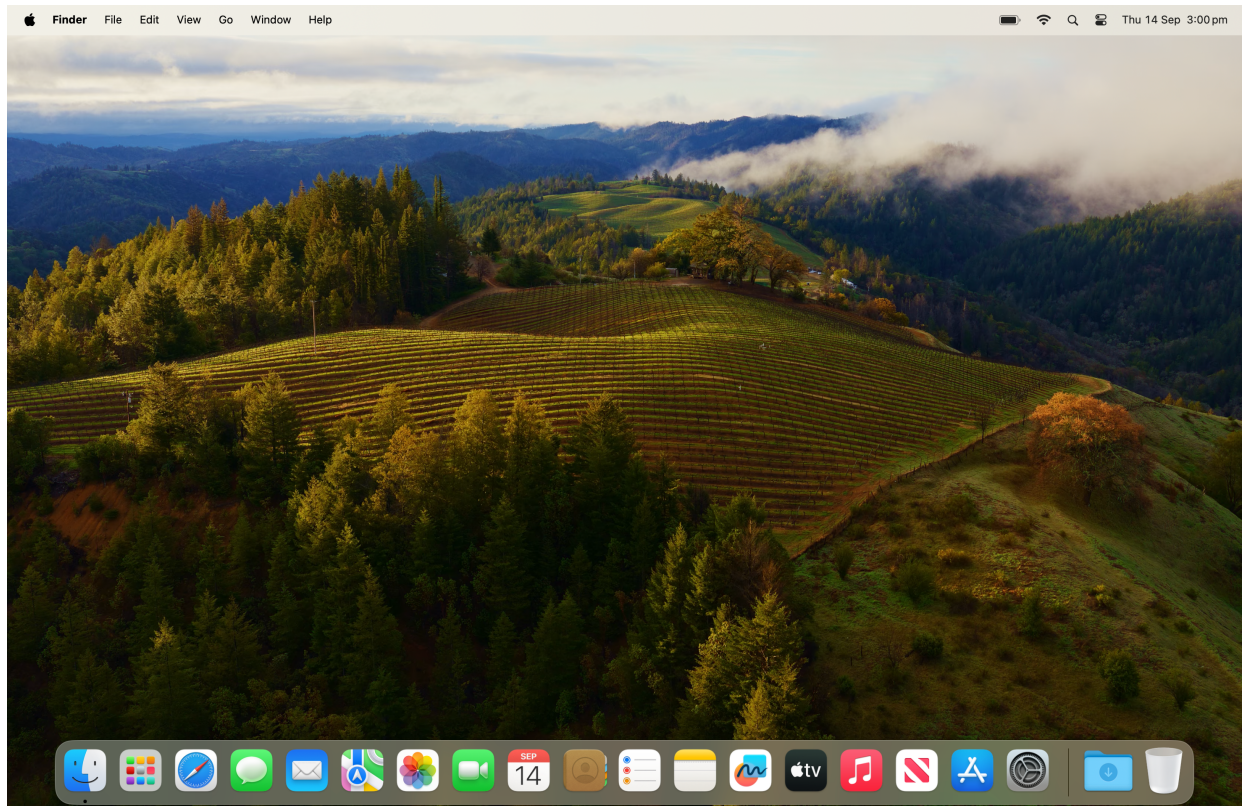
Note: You can enable Touch ID later via System Settings after Setup Assistant is complete.

Choose Your Look

Select one of the three appearance options and click Continue.

Note: You can change the appearance later via System Settings after Setup Assistant is complete.

Section 2: Enrolling Your MacBook

Enrolling your MacBook into our Mobile Device Management (MDM) solution allows ICT Services to deploy required college applications and settings.

Connect to Your Home Wi-Fi Network

To continue with the enrolment, ensure you are connected to your home Wi-Fi network.



1. Click the Wi-Fi icon in the menu bar.
2. Select your Wi-Fi network name (SSID) from the list. > **Note:** If your network does not appear, click Other Networks.
3. Enter the Wi-Fi network password.
4. Click Join.

Note: At Prince Alfred College, you will need to connect to the Wi-Fi network named "PrinceAlfredCollege" to access school services such as printing. Refer to Section 6 of this guide for instructions on connecting to the "PrinceAlfredCollege" Wi-Fi network.

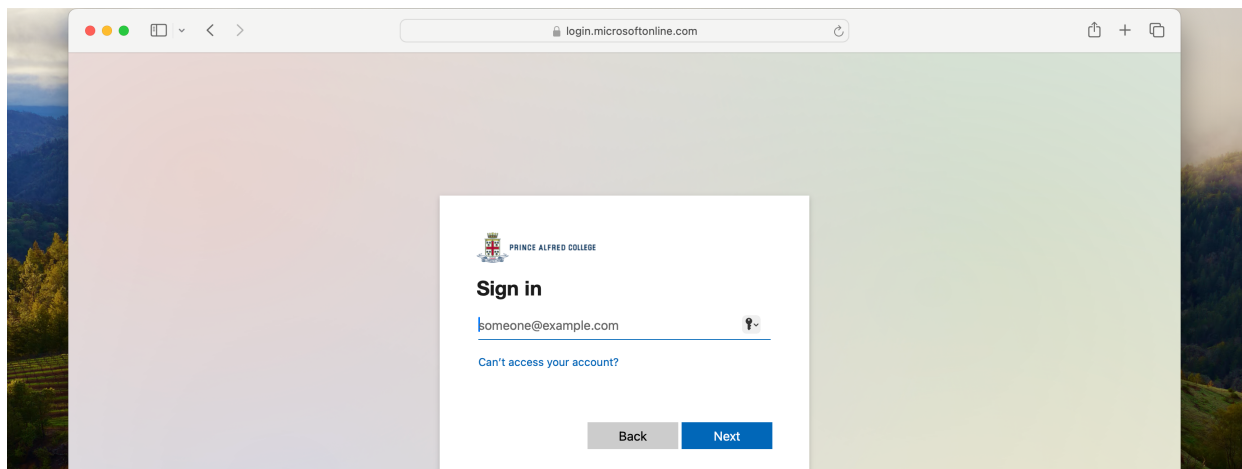
Opening the Enrolment Page

To start the enrolment process, follow these steps:



1. Open Safari from the Dock.
2. Type the URL `https://jamf.pac.edu.au/enrol` into the address bar.
3. Press the Return key.

Downloading the MDM Profile



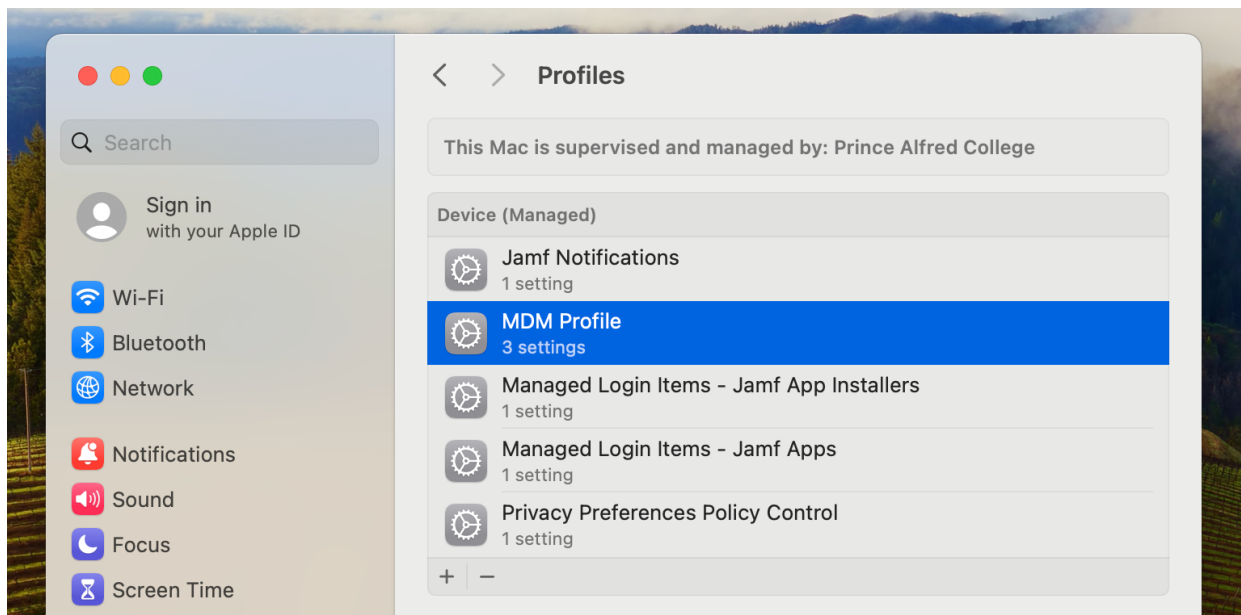
1. Enter your school email address (e.g., studentid@pac.edu.au).
2. Enter your password (use your date of birth in the format YYYYMMDD, e.g., 20020123).
3. Click Sign In.

Note: If prompted to save the password, click Not Now.

4. Click Continue.
5. Click Allow to download the MDM profile.

Installing the MDM Profile

1. Click the Apple (🍏) menu in the top-left corner of your screen.
2. Select System Settings.
3. Click Privacy & Security.
4. Scroll down and select Profiles.
5. Double-click MDM Profile and click Install.
6. Click Install again.
7. Enter your MacBook password.
8. Click Enrol.



Your MacBook will now communicate with our MDM server to deploy the necessary Configuration Profiles. This process may take 2-3 minutes to complete.

The enrolment is complete when the Self Service application opens.

Section 3: Installing Essential School Applications and Services

Use the Self Service application to install all essential school applications and services. This includes:

- Microsoft 365 for Mac
- Bitdefender
- NoMAD
- Vivi
- Follow Me Printer



To begin the installation:

1. Open the Self Service application from the Dock.
2. Select Onboarding from the sidebar.
3. Click Start Setup.

The onboarding setup will now begin installing the essential applications and services. **This process may take 10 to 15 minutes, depending on your internet connection.** Once the setup is complete, click Close and proceed to Section 4.

Section 4: Setting Up Microsoft Outlook

The school recommends using Microsoft Outlook for your school email.

Open Microsoft Outlook

Use Launchpad to find and open Microsoft Outlook on your MacBook:



1. Click the Launchpad icon in the Dock.
2. Find and click Microsoft Outlook in the list of apps.
3. Microsoft Outlook will open.

Note: If you don't see Microsoft Outlook in the list, start typing "Microsoft Outlook" to search within Launchpad.

Activate Microsoft 365 for Mac

Before you can use Microsoft Outlook, you need to sign in and activate Microsoft 365 for Mac:

1. Your school email address should be pre-filled.
2. Enter your password (use your date of birth in the format YYYYMMDD, e.g., 20020123).
3. Click Sign In.

Your Privacy Matters

When you open Microsoft Outlook for the first time, you'll see a message titled "Your Privacy Matters". Click Done to proceed.

Section 5: Setting Up OneDrive

The school recommends using OneDrive. With your school email, you receive 1TB of cloud storage. Items stored in your OneDrive folder will be accessible online across all your devices.

Open OneDrive

Use Launchpad to find and open OneDrive on your Mac:



1. Click the Launchpad icon in the Dock.
2. Locate and click OneDrive in the list of apps.
3. OneDrive will open shortly.

Note: If you can't find OneDrive in the list, start typing "OneDrive" to search within Launchpad.

Sign In to Your OneDrive Account

1. Your school email should already be entered.
2. Click Sign In.

Note: Your password may be pre-filled. If not, enter your password before continuing.

3. Click Next to keep the OneDrive folder at its default location.
4. Click Next and then OK to complete the setup.
5. Click Open OneDrive Folder to start using OneDrive.

Section 6: Finish Setting Up Your MacBook

This section must be completed onsite at Prince Alfred College and cannot be finished at home.

Connect to the PrinceAlfredCollege Wi-Fi Network

At Prince Alfred College, you need to connect to the Wi-Fi network named "PrinceAlfredCollege" to access school services, including printing.



1. Click the Wi-Fi icon in the menu bar.
2. Select PrinceAlfredCollege from the list.

Note: If PrinceAlfredCollege does not appear, click Other Networks.

3. Enter your username (Student ID).
4. Enter your password (your date of birth in the format YYYYMMDD, e.g., 20020123).
5. Click OK.
6. When prompted to authenticate to the network, click Continue.
7. Enter your MacBook password.
8. Click Update Settings.

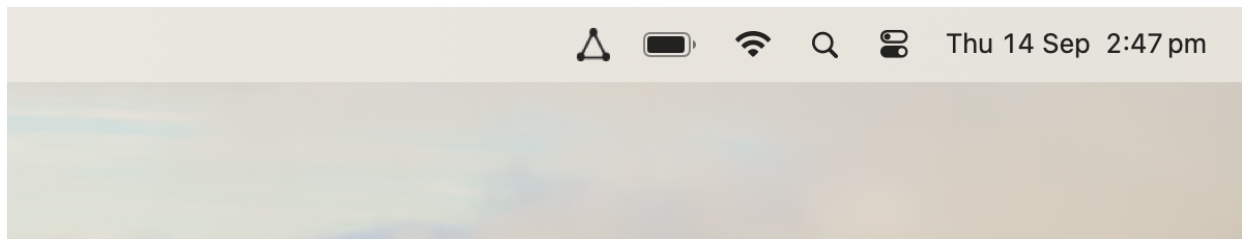
Note: If you are a Boarder at Prince Alfred College, connect to the "PAC Boarders" Wi-Fi network when in the Boarding House using the steps above. When on campus, your device will automatically connect to "PrinceAlfredCollege".

Signing Into NoMAD

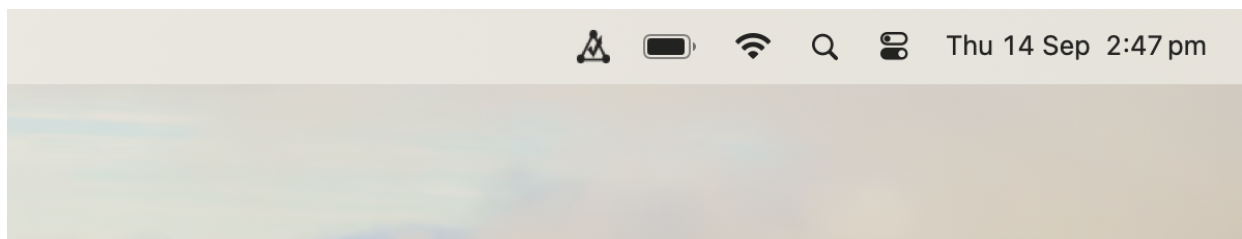
NoMAD is a menu bar application that provides printing capabilities, displays your school network password expiration, and offers shortcuts to school services while you are at school.

To sign into NoMAD, follow these steps:

Note: NoMAD will display as 'Not Connected' on home Wi-Fi networks and cannot be signed into from home.



1. Click the NoMAD icon in the menu bar at the top of your screen.
2. Select Sign In.
3. Enter your username (Student ID).
4. Enter your password (use your date of birth in the format YYYYMMDD, e.g., 20020123).
5. Click Sign In.
6. The NoMAD icon will display a check mark once you have successfully signed in.
