Write a Book in a Day is a fun, creative and collaborative challenge for students. All completed stories are included in the Online Library which is shared with hospitals around Australia for families and children undergoing treatment. This also involves a fundraising component during Book Week.

- Reading quizzes and trivia
- Story writing and publishing practice
- Promotion and fundraising for the Kid's Cancer Project.
