### **Physical Education**

All Reception to Year 6 boys receive one 60-minute Physical Education lesson weekly. Boys are allowed to wear their PE uniform to school on the day of PE. A note or email is required if there is a medical reason for any boy not participating. Boys in Years 4 to 6 attend sports training sessions on a Thursday afternoon during curriculum time to prepare them to compete in our inter-school sports program. Matches for inter-school sports occur after school and on Saturday mornings, depending on your son's sport.

Year 3 to 6 boys participate in Swimming and Cross Country in Term 1 and Sports Day in Term 3.

All Reception to Year 6 boys participate in the Chinese program offered in the Preparatory School. Year 3 to 6 boys have one thirty-minute lesson and one sixty-minute lesson per week.

The boys build knowledge, skills, and confidence in communicating in Chinese through the program. The boys also develop an understanding of the interrelationship between language and culture. The learning experiences include a range of activities such as singing, interviewing, filming, viewing, exchanging information, language games, role-plays, projects, online research, Chinese calligraphy, artwork, and cultural performances.

The Music and Art program is offered to all boys from Reception to Year 6. Through the Arts programs the boys develop their knowledge and skills in these areas. Year 5 students alll take part in a Year 5 Musical in Term 2, and the Jack de Vidas Art Exhibition in Term 3.

Year 5 also participates in a weekly Arts Hour program in Term 1 and 2, rotating through a variety of performing arts activities building skills towards the Musical.

Music - All boys receive one 60-minute lesson per week. Visual Art - All boys receive one 60-minute lesson per week.

# **Year 5 Program**

All Year 5 boys will complete the same HASS units and scope of work across each of the traditional subject areas in the Australian Curriculum. Details regarding teaching and learning programs and focus areas will be provided to parents by class teachers in the early part of each term.

### **Homework expectations**

Year 5 students must complete the equivalent of up to 40 minutes of homework each Monday to Thursday during term time – full details of the Preparatory School's Homework Policy are in the student diary. Class teachers will communicate the format and requirements for homework activities to parents early in the school year. As part of homework, boys are required to read each night for at least 20 minutes.

### **NAPLAN Testing**

Year 5 classes will continue a strong focus on literacy and numeracy skills as part of learning expectations and ongoing preparation for NAPLAN testing across school Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will be supported in ensuring they are fully aware of test formats to ensure they can complete these to the best of their ability on the day. NAPLAN testing will take place in Week 7 and 8 of Term 1.

### **Eating and drinking**

We have three eating times during the day and give the boys 10 minutes of supervised eating time during morning snack (fresh fruit or vegetables only), recess and lunch. Please remember we are a nut aware school.

#### **Parent Volunteers**

Throughout the year we require volunteers for various activities and events. All volunteers must have a valid working with children checks. There will be a volunteer information session in Week 8, March 21 at 8:30am. Please speak to your child's teacher if you are interested in coming along.

### **Belongings**

It is important to have all belongings labelled. Lost property is located at the Preparatory School front office.

#### iPad expectations / Devices at School:

iPads are used during school hours with clear purpose and supervision from teachers. iPads are charged, ready for learning and are not to be taken home unless specified. Misuse of iPads may result in restricted access.
