Specialist Teachers:

Specialist lessons are an essential part of the curriculum and are not a stand-alone component. Boys are to come to lessons prepared, orderly and sensible, and willing to learn and contribute to the lesson.

Communication between school and home is essential and we ask that if you feel the need to contact a specialist teacher, you initially do so by email.

Physical Education

All Reception to Year 6 boys receive one sixty-minute Physical Education lesson weekly. Boys are allowed to wear their PE uniform to school on the day of PE. A note or email is required if there is a medical reason for any boy not participating. Boys in Years 4 to 6 attend sports training sessions on a Thursday afternoon during curriculum time to prepare them to compete in our inter-school sports program. Matches for inter-school sports occur after school and on Saturday mornings, depending on your son's sport.

Year 3 to 6 boys participate in Swimming and Cross Country in Term 1 and Sports Day in Term 3.

Language- Chinese

All Reception to Year 6 boys participate in the Chinese program offered in the Preparatory School. Reception to Year 2 boys have two thirty-minute lessons or one sixtyminute lesson per week. Year 3 to 6 boys have one thirtyminute lesson and one sixty-minute lesson per week. The boys build knowledge, skills, and confidence in communicating in Chinese through the program. The boys also develop an understanding of the interrelationship between language and culture. The learning experiences include a range of activities such as singing, interviewing, filming, viewing, exchanging information, language games, role-plays, projects, online research, Chinese calligraphy, artwork, and cultural performances.

<u>The Arts</u>

The Music and Art program is offered to all boys from Reception to Year 6. Through the Arts programs the boys develop their knowledge and skills in these areas.

Music - All boys receive one sixty-minute lesson per week.

Visual Art - All boys receive one sixty-minute lesson per week.

All boys will take part in a Year 5 Musical in Term 3, and the Jack de Vidas Art Exhibition in Term 3.

Year 5 also participate in a weekly Arts Hour program in Term 2 and 3, rotating through a variety of performing arts activities.

<u>STEM</u>

Boys in Year 5 will have STEM lessons in our specialist STEM classroom (The Lab), with our STEM teacher.

Homework

Year 5 students must complete the equivalent of up to 40 minutes of homework each Monday to Thursday during term time – full details of the Preparatory School's Homework Policy are in the student diary. Class teachers will communicate the format and requirements for homework activities to parents early in the school year. As part of homework, boys are required to read each night for at least 20 minutes.

NAPLAN Testing

Year 5 classes will continue a strong focus on literacy and numeracy skills as part of learning expectations and ongoing preparation for NAPLAN testing across school Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will be supported in ensuring they are fully aware of test formats to ensure they can complete these to the best of their ability on the day. NAPLAN testing will take place in Week 7 and 8 of Term 1 in 2024.
