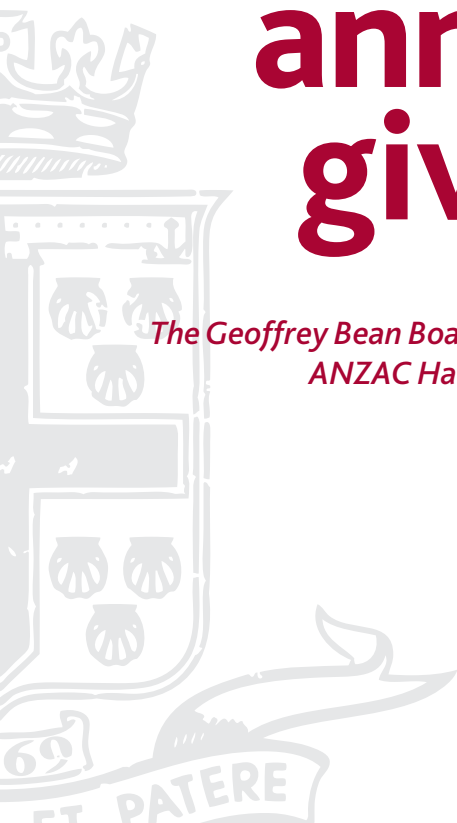

Since 1963 ANZAC Hall (the Assembly Hall) has been Prince Alfred College's pre-eminent community space.

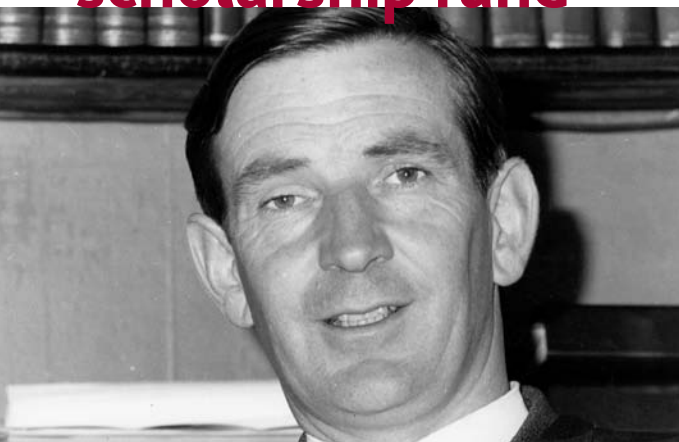

The Geoffrey Bean Boarding Scholarship will assist a student entering at any level between Year 7 and Year 11, who is of good character, conduct and attitude, and of all round capability. Demonstrated financial need will also be taken into consideration in the selection process.
