# year 12 results 2017




We are pleased to report on the excellent academic performance of our graduating students from 2017. The 2017 median ATAR score was 87.55, representing the third successive year of growth in this key academic measure. The median ATAR now stands 4.7 points higher than in 2014, and we look forward to further improvement in 2018.

Douglas Gerard and Anthony Rositano were named as joint Duces of the College and were both awarded the John Dunn Prize. Both boys achieved 44 of a possible 45 points in the IB Diploma, converting to an ATAR of 99.85, with five subject merits apiece. SACE student Hamish McKenzie won the E B Colton Prize (Proxime Accessit to Dux of School), with an ATAR of 99.80 and four subject merits.

The number of merits awarded has increased by over 70% since 2015, and it is pleasing to note that 33 individual boys (25% of our graduates) were responsible for attaining these merits.

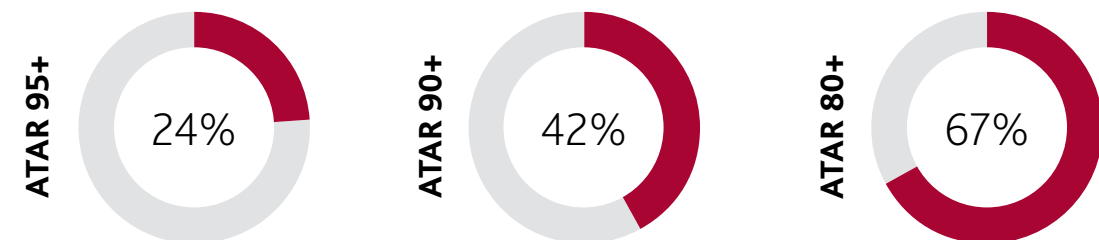

We recognise at this time the good work of all our teachers in achieving these steadily improving Year 12 results over the last three years. 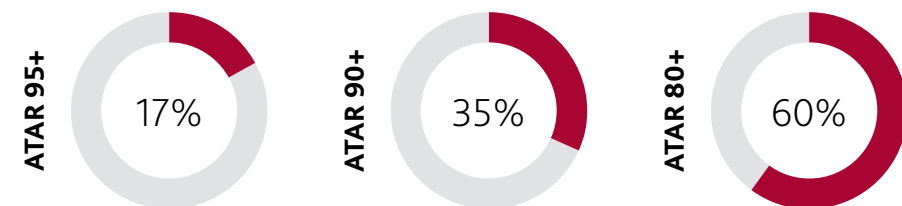

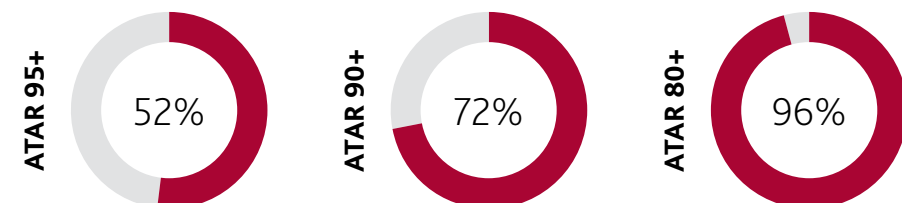
### SACE and IBDP combined ATARs



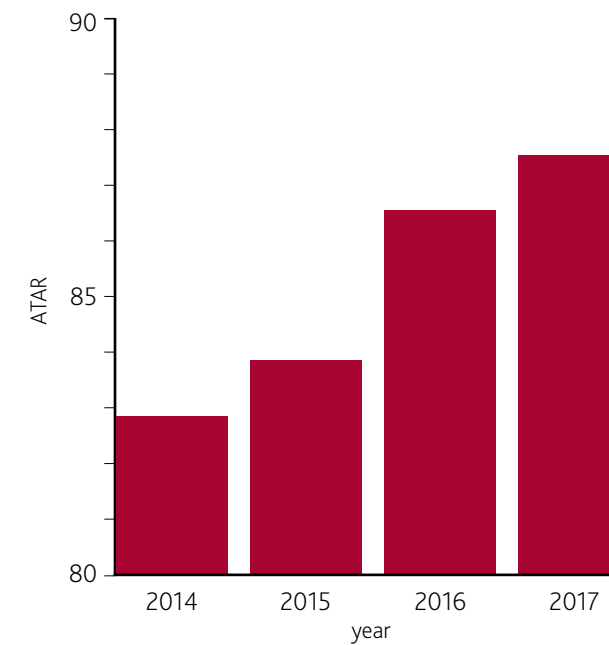
### SACE ATARs



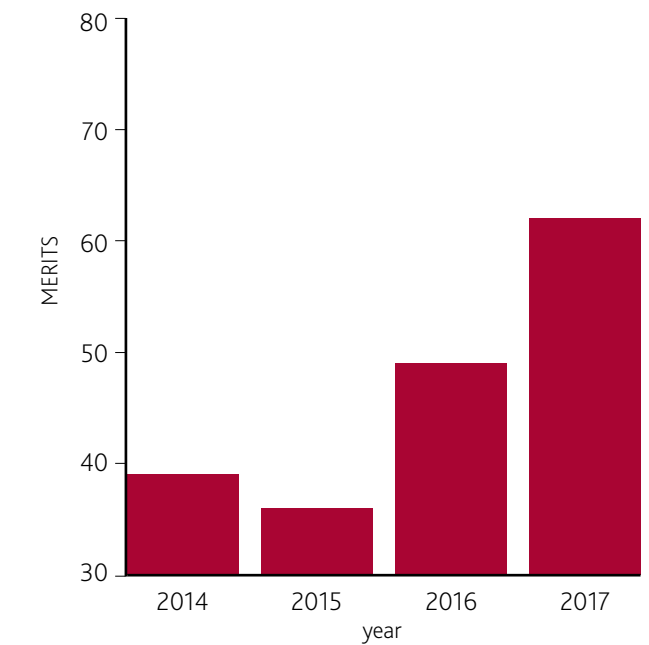
### IBDP ATARs
