We are pleased to report on the excellent academic performance of our graduating students from 2018.


The 2018 median ATAR score was 88.80, representing the fourth successive year of growth in this key academic measure. The median ATAR now stands 5.95 points higher than in 2014, and we are aiming for further improvement in the future.

Shine Wang was named as Dux of School for a perfect ATAR of 99.95 and was also awarded the Sir Thomas Elder Prize. In addition, Shine received six subject merits. Dejun (Jack) Cai was awarded the E B Colton Prize (Proxime Accessit to Dux of School) for an IB score of 44 (out of a possible 45 points), an ATAR of 99.85 and six subject merits. Jack achieved the perfect score of seven in all of his academic subjects.

The number of merits awarded has increased by over 70% since 2015.

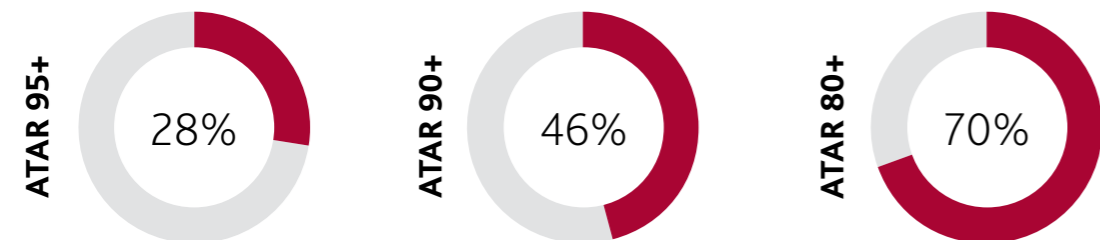
It is natural to focus on the top performers in any year group, and boys who join the 'Over 95' Club (named below) are rightly lauded. We are also delighted with any score that represents the student's best efforts and sees him achieve his potential.

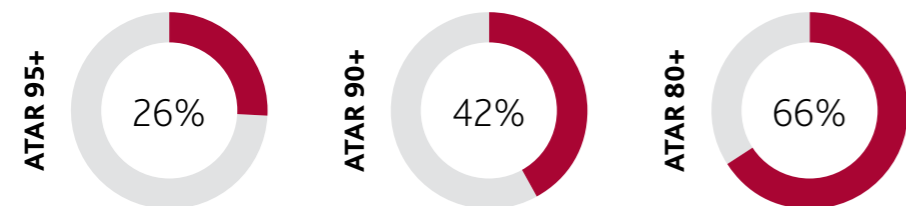

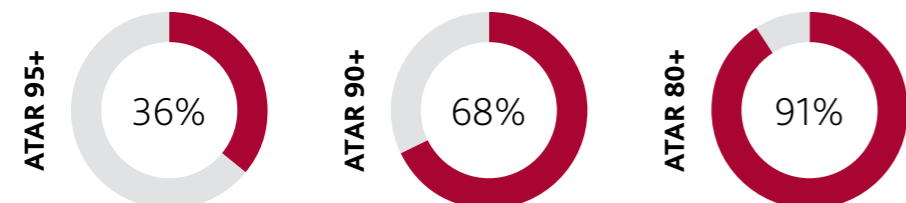
### SACE and IBDP combined ATARs



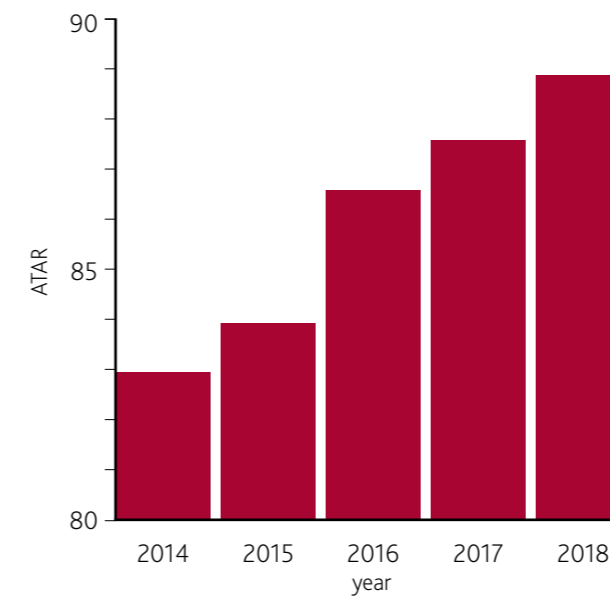
### SACE ATARs



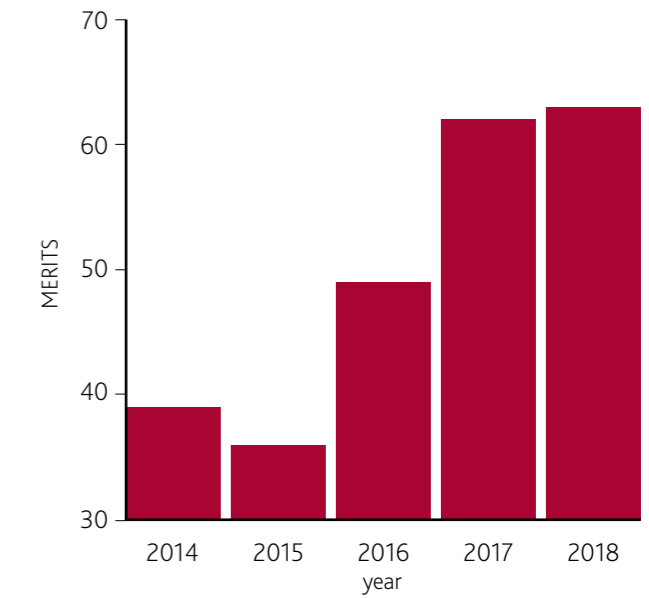
### IBDP ATARs
