THE NEW BOARDING HOUSE

The construction of the new state-of-the-art boarding facility builds on almost 150 years of boarding tradition at Prince Alfred College, and is a significant commitment to providing the best possible facilities for our boarding students.


In our Sesquicentenary year, boarders will move into the new boarding house.



ANZAC HALL UPGRADE

Since 1963 Anzac Hall (the Assembly Hall) has been Prince Alfred College's pre-eminent community space.

Sophisticated ceremonies, musical performance, to technologically savvy teaching environment, Anzac Hall needs to be a truly multifunctional space. Upgrade work will include an enlarged proscenium, increased stage area, reshaped front walls to improve stage sight lines, upgraded sound and light systems, and new seating.



WAMBANA EXPANSION

Wambana is situated on six acres of coast line bordered by the township of Point Turton and rural farming land, on the Southern Yorke Peninsula.

Wambana is a purpose built facility to educate adolescent boys for an extended period of time. The primary purpose of Wambana is to foster growth by helping adolescent boys better manage the transition to adulthood through immersion in community, academic, spiritual and outdoor adventures.

A decade of students have passed through Wambana, and it is time to expand to enable more students to experience this truly unique facility and its program.
